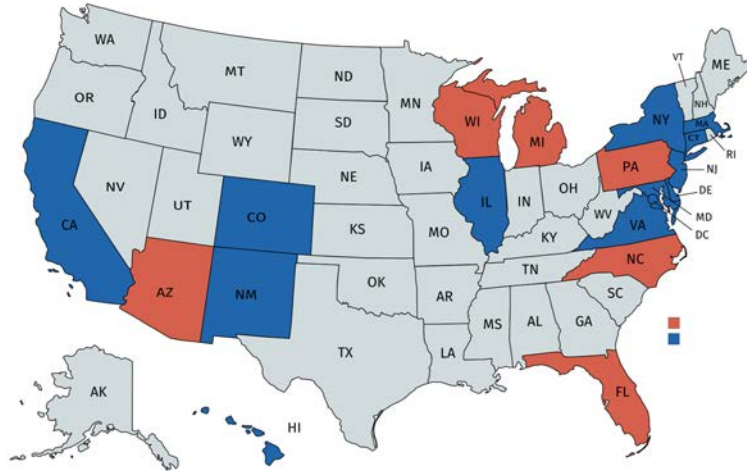

Battleground states



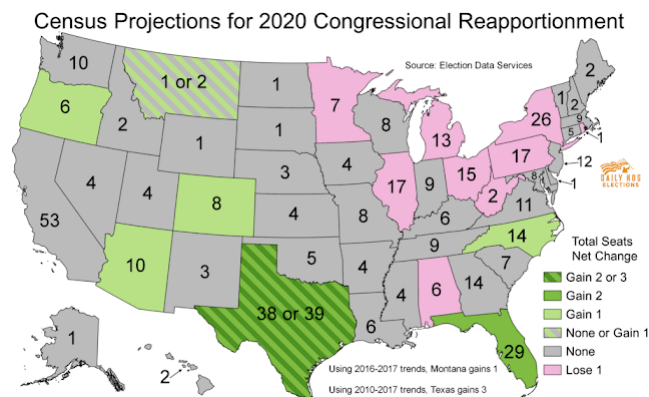

Senate

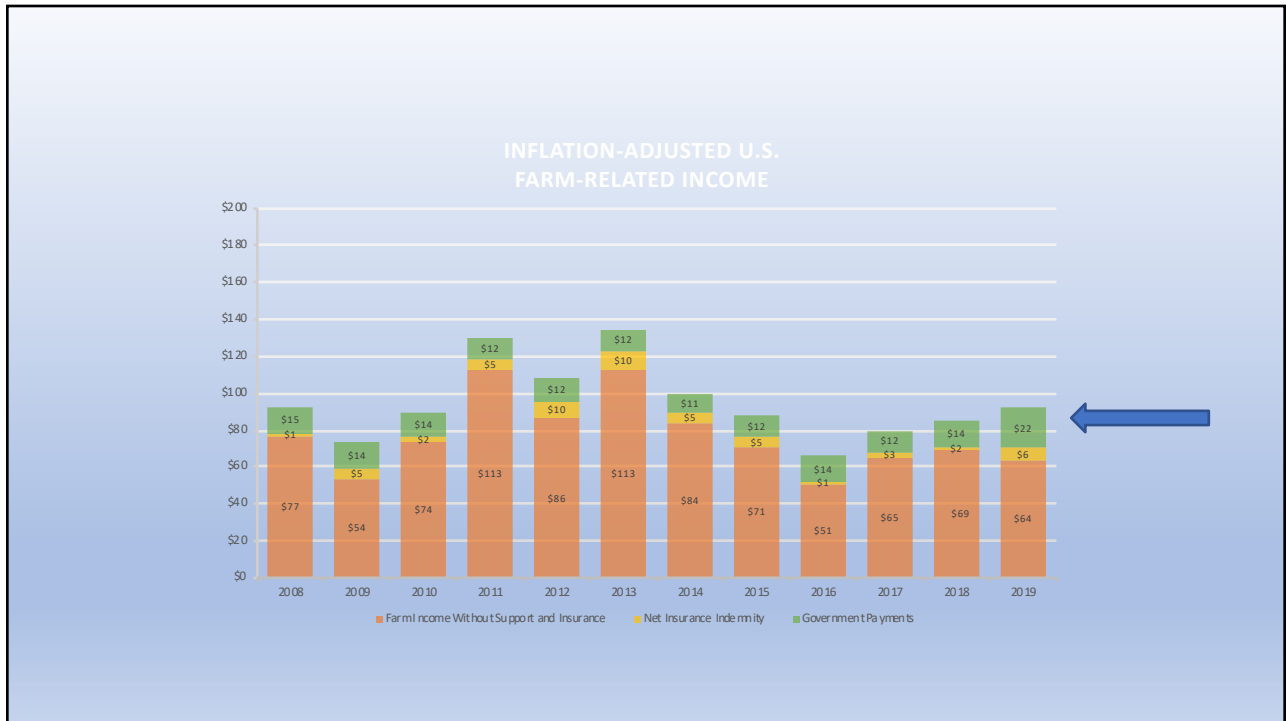
- **53 R's, 45 D's, 2 I's**
